Goal #1:

By the end of 2023-2024 school year, 70% of K-6 students will achieve typical or above typical growth as measured by Pathways of Progress or maintain benchmark levels of proficiency on their composite score on the end-of-year Acadience Reading Assessment.

Goal #1 Action Steps

We will provide professional development to teachers to build their capacity in Tier I, Tier II, and Tier III reading instruction and provide materials and resources needed for the professional learning. We will also provide substitutes for faculty members attending training and to administer assessments. Teachers will also be given opportunities to collaborate outside of contract time and be compensated with a stipend.	\$20,000
We will provide the necessary materials and technology for instruction and interventions. This may include printed and online resources/subscriptions.	\$10,000
We will lease Chromebooks for all students giving access to online support for reading and writing.	\$33,000
Paraprofessionals will be hired to cover classes so that teachers may meet in grade-level Professional Learning Communities (PLC) in order to develop, use, and analyze assessments in Language Arts. These employees will provide instruction in computers, character education, science, and art. They will also be used for intervention support.	\$35,000
School wide teams will be put together to analyze data and develop school wide systems for supporting instruction which may include instruction, intervention, and behavior support. Teachers and staff on these teams will be paid stipends for their extra responsibilities.	\$8,000

Goal # 1 Measures of Success

Students, K-6, will be assessed on foundational reading skills using the Acadience Reading Assessment three times in the school year; at the beginning of the year (BOY), middle of the year (MOY), and at the end of the year (EOY). The Acadience Reading Assessment measures student proficiency and determines student levels as "intensive," "strategic," "benchmark," and "above benchmark." Data gathered from the Acadience Reading Assessment is entered into the Pathways of Progress program. The Pathways of Progress program measures their progress in growth from BOY to EOY and determines that growth as "well below typical," "below typical," "typical," "above typical," and "well above typical" growth. The desired levels are "benchmark" or above for proficiency and "typical" or above for growth.

Goal #2

By the end of 2023-2024 school year, we will have an increase of 2% in the number of students achieving proficiency on the 2024 RISE assessment for grades 3-6 in Math and for grades 4-6 in Science.

We will hire part-time paraprofessionals to help with math interventions and support teachers in their math instruction.	\$35,000
We will update, maintain, and provide necessary technology to support instruction and student engagement.	\$10,000
We will provide the necessary materials and technology for instruction and interventions for math and science. This may include printed and online resources.	\$10,000
We will pay a stipend to two licensed teachers to work as building EdTechs to provide professional learning and to support the use of technology throughout the building.	\$1,500
We will pay a stipend to three licensed teachers to run the school robotics program.	\$3,000
Depending on student enrollment and staffing, additional school employees may be hired which may include licensed teachers or classified employees to reduce class sizes. If this is not needed, this portion will go towards more paraprofessionals for intervention support to be hired.	\$40,000

student a proficiency score as either "Below Proficient = 1, Approaching Proficient = 2, Proficient = 3, and Highly Proficient = 4." Students who receive a score of 3 or 4 are considered proficient.
