Principal's News

The first quarter is over, and we are well on our way to another great year! We have completed our Community Council elections, and I am pleased to announce that, Christine Ruiz and Kenny Olsen have been added to the Kanesville Elementary School Community Council. Our Community Council will be meeting on November 18, January 20, March 16, and April 27 at 1:30 in the conference room and you are always welcome to attend.

A couple of reminders:

1. No vehicles are allowed in the bus circle at any time. Please use the student drop off zone in front of the school when dropping off and picking up your children. State law prohibits parking in a school bus zone, and the Sherriff's department has assured me that they will be patrolling the area and ticketing cars in the bus loading area.
2. As the weather changes, please make sure that your children come to school ready to be outside in the weather. Recesses will be held outside unless precipitation is such that students will be too wet to be comfortable in class or the temperature is so low that exposed skin may be damaged. Winter coats, hats and gloves should be with students whenever the weather is cold. Remember, the school doors open at 8:35 so please drop your students off as close to that time as possible while making sure that your students are on time to start class. Students who are at school prior to the doors opening will spend their time outside unless conditions exist that meet the inside recess parameters stated above. We have aides available to supervise the students beginning at 8:15 when the busses arrive, but no supervision is available for students dropped off prior to that time.
3. Thank you for adapting so well to the school rules regarding adults in the hallways and classrooms. Please remember that if you need to speak with a teacher you are to come to the office and we will call them down for you. If they need to take you to the classroom to address your issue, they will take you with them at that time. Thanks to all of the volunteers who come to the school regularly for your help and for using the sign in sheet in the office so that we can track volunteerism in our school.

As we approach cold and flu season, please be aware of these symptoms that would merit a sick day at home.

- Repeated diarrhea and/or vomiting **within the past 24 hours.**
- A fever in the range of 102 to 104 degrees, especially accompanied by lethargy.
- A severe cold with fever, sneezing and thickened nasal discharge means stay at home.
- A sore throat combined with a fever or swollen glands.
- A cough that keeps a child awake at night, worsens with increased activity, or is combined with other symptoms generally merits a day off.
- A severe and persistent earache may be a sign of acute otitis media, a common ear infection, and merits a trip to the doctor.
- Redness in the whites of eyes, yellow eye discharge and matted eyelashes are symptoms of conjunctivitis, commonly known as pinkeye. Again, call the doctor.
- Rashes, if they are all over the body, blistering, oozing or sore, they could be a sign of a contagious infection.
- Head lice-please treat before sending to school.
- Breathing trouble.
- Not eating for more than a day.

Camp Read-A-Lot

The library has a program called Camp Read-A-Lot. During the student's weekly library time, each student will have the opportunity to read in the Camp Read-A-Lot tent. Students take turns (going in alphabetical order) and have the choice to read alone or choose a friend to read with them inside the tent on bean bags.



Once a student has completed a book they can fill out a Camp Read-A-Lot Hunting Licence and put it into the drawing. Books do not have to be completed only in the tent.
